# OPM100625/04 Planning Applications received. (Part 1)

- ▶ Planning Reference: CM9/0225/43 (Heidelberg) at Land West of Scropton, Leathersley Lane, Scropton, DE65 5DN: Proposal: Extraction of sand and gravel with restoration to agriculture and biodiversity with public amenity access, creation of flood storage areas, construction of a new access off Leathersley Lane, erection of processing plant and machinery and ancillary operations including weighbridge, office, welfare and wheelwash on land off Leathersley Lane, Scropton.
- Overview Heidelberg presentation: understands the requirements local community
- Overview Cemex presentation: somewhat indifferent concerning roads and local community needs

# Foston and Scropton Concerns and Protection of Scropton Village

Currently protection from the village 7.5 tonne vehicle limit A50 end of Watery Lane and 7.5 tonne vehicle limit at Sudbury (A515) except for access.

Requirement: To protect the village of Scropton and sections of Hatton to re-site the 7.5T limit sign at the westerly end of Leathersley lane to a position east of the Heidelberg quarry access. This would then place both quarry entrances outside of the 7.5T limits making HGV's that access the quarries via Scropton and Hatton illegal and compliance would be enforceable by law and have full legal recourse to prevent that happening

# **Statement of Community Involvement (SCI)**

6.1.2.

Subsequent to the introduction of inert importation for restoration at the behest of the DCC landscape officer, the restoration scheme has since been further amended. The submitted scheme includes the reinstatement of footpath FP10 along its current alignment and topographical levels, with grassland adjacent and simplification of the water bodies in the southern areas (whilst retaining the flood storage and biodiversity opportunities). The proposed permissive footpaths have been increased to include a connecting route across the restored features in the centre of the restored Site, thus providing both short and longer route options.

To start: remove the topsoil off, then beyond the topsoil down to overburden and store separately. When extraction finishes the overburden and topsoil are replaced to wetlands with islands and connecting walkways. A little area going back to agriculture. **Confirmation required from Heidelberg.** 

# 6.1.3.

Community comments included the request for a small parking area within the restored site for visitors e.g. by retaining a portion of the new access and plant site. However, others were opposed to this idea on the basis it could attract anti-social behaviour. HMUK therefore did not include the feature and decided to await what the consensus was through the planning application process taking all consultations into account, while being willing to include such an area as a condition of a grant of planning permission.

We consider this should be a condition of the planning as otherwise people arriving by car will likely park in the vicinity of the Scropton village. The site for a potential car park, as referenced in the statement, is of a sufficient distance away from the village as to have little if any impact on Scropton village from users behaving anti socially. Otherwise, where is everybody going to park? Parking in the village is not acceptable and will cause traffic build-up.

Heidelberg have the option to purchase the land which is why they are proactive with the end arrangements of Nature Reserve and Walkways. Sudbury end of Leathersley is owned by the Estate to be turned back to Agricultural land.

# Land Fill:-

870,000 tonnes of land fill material for Sudbury. HGV C.C. 20 tonnes = 43,000 HGV loads. 970,000 tonnes of land fill material for Scropton end. HGV C.C. 20 tonnes = 48,500 HGV loads.

A50, 10,000 vehicle and a day road? Figure needs clarifying

The Quarries will go ahead - Foston and Scropton Parish Council are looking at minimise any implications. Quarry works to take 11 years

# End use of extraction – transport route. Further information required.

### 6.1.6.

In regard to the impacts on Leathersley Lane and traffic generated by the Scheme the Application proposes:

• Road widening and the creation of a purpose built access and right turn lane to create a safer junction design;

Cemex development does not offer the same provision and they stated that what they proposed met highways requirements. They would not move on this view and were adamant that they would proceed as per the provisions shown on the exhibition.

• Routeing agreements to ensure all vehicles associated with the quarry development route west to and from the A515 and not through Scropton, monitored through CCTV and enforced in accordance with HMUK policies;

Not be lawfully enforceable. To be legally enforce this is to move the 7.5 Tonne limit that currently starts at the western end of Leathersley lane, to a position East of the Heidelberg site access location. This has already been indicated to the planners as part of the F&SPC comments at an earlier stage of the planning process.

• The application is supported by a detailed Transport Assessment which concludes that the proposed access will be safe and that the existing highway network can accommodate the proposed traffic generated by the Scheme;

Need to check the 7.5 Tonne weight limit sign to the east of Heidelberg's entrance will have been included.

Heidelberg will be removing hedges to make visible splays and widen Leathersley Lane to 3 lanes at entrance – to have pull in lane for their vehicles to keep traffic flowing.

Cemex entrance – no change to Leathersley Road.

• Commitment by HMUK to support the reduction of speeds on Leathersley Lane to 40mph if pursued by the local community. 7.5 Tonne sign placement is more significant to protecting Scropton from HGV's associated with the quarry site.

The A515 runs through Draycott, already in place 40 mph with cameras.

There have been serious accidents on the A50 Sudbury roundabout. The police will divert and will legally override any 7.5 tonne weight limit.

Main concern is protecting the villages.

# Request to Cllr. Redfern:-

- 1. 7.5 tonne limit Scropton village side of Heidelberg entrance
- 2. 7.5 tonne limit both ends of Sudbury village
- 3. Solution on A515 at Leathersley Lane and Main Road regarding traffic flow. E.g.
  - a. Additional roundabout
  - b. Traffic lights
  - c. Yellow box
  - d. Call for S238 agreement on the applicant (Section 278 agreements provide developers with the authority to develop existing highway networks by permitting alterations to be made)
  - e. Ask Highways to attend a joint meeting visiting site, A515 and seeing first hand volume of traffic already using the A515 / Sudbury junction. Meeting to be a peak traffic time.

- f. Traffic lights on the bridge before Sudbury Garage. New entrance on A515 near the bridge (field with water course) have a central reservation for the lorries to turn into the site and any lorries queuing up to come out could be queuing up on the site road.

# Report from Cllr. Grahame Andrew

A number of Planning enforcement actions ongoing - WT tankers who have an application that's supposed to be going in to get a connection for their tankers which are on the old Turkey farm site to get them to go through the business park and that's waiting on the council's legal department agreeing the wording of Section 106 agreement.

The coach, maintenance works on Woodyard Lane which has been causing problems with the residents because of the site locality. Hasn't yet had its application come through to try and regularise it. Waiting on biodiversity report Try to insist our planning enforcement people take proactive action, set them a deadline. If they don't make it, prosecute them.

Bus Stop cleaning at Foston – Cllr. Grahame Andrew will chase.

Julie Patten is the District Councillor for Hatton and she's working on a case on Derby Road where the people that own the site have set up their own car sales and all doing various works at the back of the plot on what was on agricultural lane. A stop notice has been served on the landowner from doing any further development. If they do any more building work, they will be in breach of that and taken to court.
