#### **Report from Cllr Peter Smith:**

The New Year is the perfect time to make some changes to our health and wellbeing and for anyone who needs a little help and advice around healthy changes, stopping smoking, weight management or getting active it's free at: livelifebetterderbyshire.org.uk

South Derbyshire District Council has successfully bid for government funding to enable a further 24 electric recharge points to be installed in three District Council owned car parks across the area. £90,000 of funding will come from the Office for Zero Emission Vehicles and will enable publicly accessible charge points to be installed in car parks in Hatton, Hilton and Melbourne. The remaining cost of the installation will be met by BP Pulse who are the private sector delivery partner. The District Council already offers the following charging points...

- One Rapid Charge where a battery can be charged in 20 60 minutes, are located at the Council's Bus Station car park, Swadlincote, DE11 0AH.
- Fast Charge Points where a battery can be charged in 4 6 hours, at Rink Drive, Swadlincote, Local residents are being provided with an additional reason to switch to electric as they can apply for a discount card at <a href="http://www.chargeyourcar.org.uk/d2n2/">http://www.chargeyourcar.org.uk/d2n2/</a>. There is a £20 yearly fee for the card, however, this provides access to a reduced tariff which currently saves 20p per kWh charge. Provision of the new charging points is the latest initiative in South Derbyshire District Council's bid to become carbon-neutral by 2030, having declared a Climate Emergency in 2019.

SDDC have a mobile Safer Homes service which is operated by South Derbyshire CVS and available to any elderly or vulnerable South Derbyshire residents that are over 60. Two inspiring commemorative tree plantings took place at Rosliston Forestry Centre yesterday afternoon.

A Japanese Flowering Cherry tree was planted in the picnic area by specially invited guest, Misako Sato from the Japanese School in Etwall. The tree has been donated to mark the school's 30th anniversary and to celebrate Rosliston Forestry Centre and South Derbyshire's close and long-standing connection to Japan and Toyota City.

Misako Sato was joined by the Leader, Chair, Vice-Chair and the Chief Executive of South Derbyshire District Council along with staff members and volunteers from the Forestry Centre.

In the second ceremony three greengages were planted adding to the Tree Trail on site which starts outside the sensory garden and includes over 30 different species of tree.

The tree planting ceremony signified the start of The Queens' Platinum Jubilee celebrations taking place in the Summer at Rosliston Forestry Centre. This week was chosen as Sunday marked 70 years since the Queen's accession to the throne.

This ceremony was hosted jointly by the Council and Forestry England who are the landowners at Rosliston Forestry Centre. Lizzie Hartshorne from Forestry England, John Everitt from the National Forest Company and Councillor Kevin Richards from South Derbyshire District Council each spoke about the significance of the Jubilee event and of tree planting for the benefit of the natural environment.

Partners and guests then joined the Rosliston Ranger volunteers in planting some additional trees in a new Jubilee Hedge which overlooks Jubilee Meadow. Jubilee Meadow is dominated by a giant "ER70" wildflower motif which will blossom over the coming months making a spectacular tribute to Her Majesty.

The Tree Trail, Jubilee Hedge and Meadow are all in place and set to bloom into life this summer thanks to the support and generosity of many donations, partners, corporate groups and volunteers.

A total of 1,600 trees have been ordered for the Jubilee Hedge and meadow area thanks to grants and donations from the Tree Council, The Trust for Conservation Volunteering, The Woodland Trust and Arcus Global. All have been planted by volunteers this winter.

#### Comments from the Public:

There has been a number of incidence's and near accidents to pedestrians on Watery Lane due to speeding vehicles. There is no pavement for residents, i.e. school children, dog walkers, non drivers.

- Local speed watch group but only can be done in the 30mph speed limitation area
- Footpath/pavement between the 2 riding schools
- Piping in and paying a pavement over the brook
- Police and County Council to be informed every time of the situation then they will see there is a problem
- Safe spots for pedestrians
- Signage grant available
- Highways signage issue photographic evidence, speed limit signs/road markings

  - a) 40 mph area on Watery Lane is insufficiently marked and need visiting
  - b) Look to upgrade signage
  - c) Photos and video of whole length
